

Do I need a library card?

We do not require a library card to borrow materials. Instead, patrons are registered in our computer system. Local residents may borrow library materials for up to three weeks.

Need to Use a Computer?

The library offers four public Internet work stations, with computer, monitor, printer and headphones. These computers feature Microsoft Word, Outlook, Access, Excel, FrontPage, PhotoDraw, PowerPoint and Publisher and others. Most of these programs have self-paced tutorials available, both on-screen, via audio and through instructional texts.

Other Equipment Available

Our computer digital photography station has:

- Adobe Photoshop Elements
- CD Writer
- Scanner for picture, slides and negatives

We also have a media room, with TV/ VCR/DVD Player for viewing our audio-visual materials.

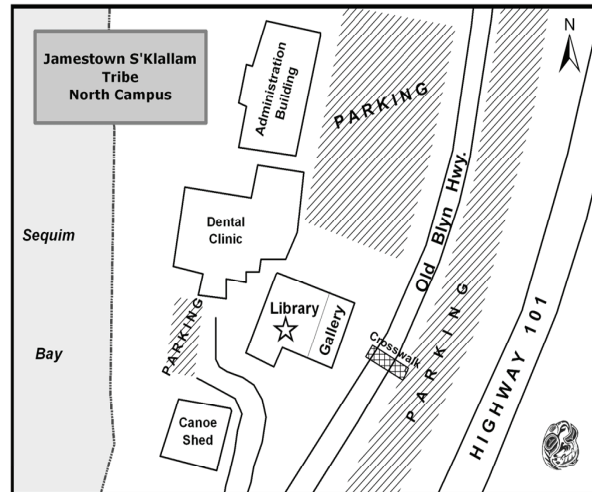
You Can Listen, Too!

The primary focus of our library is Native American materials. Our goal is to provide access to materials that may not be available in other public libraries.



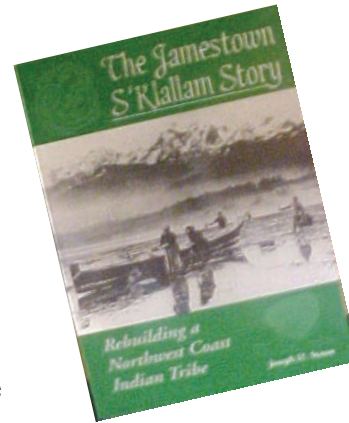
We have a special collection of rare reference materials including documents that tell the story of the S'Klallam People and the other Native people in our area.
